

THE M20 MOTORWAY - NORTHWEST OF JUNCTION 9 TEMPORARY OVERNIGHT SPEED RESTRICTION

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order on the M20 Motorway, northwest of Ashford in the County of Kent, under section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 because works are proposed to be executed on the road.

The effect of the Order is to impose an overnight temporary mandatory 50mph speed restriction on the coastbound carriageway of the M20 between Hurstford Lane overbridge and Station Road underbridge northwest of Junction 9 (A20/A251). This is in the interests of road safety while lane closures take place to enable contractors to install a new police observation platform.

It is expected that the work will last for approximately 6 weeks starting on or after Monday 6 February 2012 between 20:00 and 06:00 (maximum period).

The Order will come into force on 4 February 2012 and have a maximum duration of eighteen months.

The temporary mandatory speed restriction and lane closures will be clearly indicated by traffic signs when they are in operation during the works periods.
